	and carriage). To the side of the gate on the footpath there is a			
	2m gap. These gates are left open during daylight hours and closed			
	at night to stop unauthorised vehicles gaining access and fly tipping.			
	The LAF are satisfied that access is not being obstructed to			
	authorised users of these public rights of way. Now modifications			
	have been made to the gate, waiting to see if further action is			
	taken by the complainants.
