NOTES: Asset valuations are based on a variety of methodologies in accordance with the financial regulations applicable to each partner. Methods may include Depreciated Replacement Cost, Market Value or Existing Use Value. Valuations include data received from the Greater Brighton public sector partnership. Central government asset ownership is excluded from this exercise. The base dates for the valuations will vary between assets. The valuations shown are the latest available as at December 2016. The method of categorising assets may vary between partners. Further details of each partner's assets are available via the on-line map and associated asset list available from our website. Generally the valuation totals listed above represent the total value of the assets owned freehold by the respective partners across their operating region. In some cases their operating region will be larger than the Greater Brighton region.
