

(figures in brackets show the change from 2019/20)







Adult Social Care Precept

April 2020 to March 2021

For councils like Brighton & Hove City Council with adult social care responsibilities, the Secretary of State has made the following statement to explain any charge for adult social care included in the council tax increase.

The Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government has made an offer to local authorities defined as 'adult social care authorities' under Part 1 of the Care Act 2014.

The offer was the option of an adult social care authority being able to charge an additional 'precept' on its council tax without holding a referendum, to assist the authority in meeting expenditure on adult social care.

In relation to the financial year 2020/21 the Secretary of State has determined (and the House of Commons has approved) a referendum principle of 4%, comprising 2% for expenditure on adult social care and 2% for other expenditure. Adult social care authorities may therefore set a maximum council tax of 3.99% in 2020/21 without holding a referendum.

The Adult Social Care Precept for Brighton & Hove City Council

Brighton & Hove City Council is charging a further 2% adult social care precept in 2020/21 to provide additional funding for spending pressures in adult social care which include:

- Demographic growth (including children transitioning into adult social care)
- Increased complexity of care across all community care services
- Increasing commissioning costs due to pressures across the social care provider market.
