


# NATURE DETECTIVE - GOLD, GO WILD!

Can you see any insects?	<b>From our expert, Peter Wood:</b> Lesser Celandine ( <i>Ficaria verna</i> ) is one of the first nectar sources available for early pollinators.  The cheerful flowers of this perennial herb (or weed) are native to our woodlands and now our gardens.
