

Car Free Week will lead up to the launch of a new campaign starting in October.



FREE Coastal Biodiversity Healthwalk

Come and join us to discover the new Black Rock beach boardwalk and experience its rare local biodiversity habitat. Our biodiversity officer will share their expertise and guide you through this area, home to thousands of specially grown plants and seeds provided by Kew Gardens.

The meeting point is at the Volks Railway Depot on Madeira Drive, at the junction with Dukes Mound at 3pm, Monday 19 September. This will be a leisurely flat walk which will last about an hour and is accessible for wheelchair and mobility aid users. There is no need to book ahead. This walk will be cancelled in the event of extreme weather.



20 September

School Streets taster morning

The council's School Streets team will be on hand at Aldrington Primary School on Eridge Road to deliver a School Streets taster day during the morning drop-off on Tuesday 20 September. On this morning, the road leading to the school gate will be closed to all non-exempt motor vehicle traffic from 8.15am-9.15am, and the school community will be encouraged to take part in this experience by walking, wheeling, or scooting to school.

Aldrington Primary will be taking part in the council's School Streets programme in the 22/23 academic year when an option will be developed to implement a School Street scheme on a more permanent basis. Parents and carers, pupils and local residents are encouraged to come and see how the school street works and chat to the team who will be available to answer questions during the closure period.



Did you know...? The council is committed to delivering a programme of **School Streets** to schools across the city. There are currently six in operation.
