NOTICE is hereby given that Brighton & Hove City Council ("the Council") has on 21 February 2024 made the Orders named below under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended and Traffic Management Act 2004 which when it comes into operation on 4 March 2024 will introduce various changes to the waiting or parking restrictions in the part or parts of the roads identified:

Brighton & Hove Various Controlled Parking Zones Consolidation Order 2018 Amendment Order No.3 2024 (ref: TRO-43a-2023)

This Order when it comes into force will introduce pedal cycle hire docking places in the following locations:

- Zone A Hampstead Road One car club space will be removed and current waiting restrictions amended to allow for the installation of the docking place.
- Zone C –Queen's Park Terrace the parking restrictions will be amended to allow for the installation of the docking place. It is also proposed to convert a section of permit holders only parking in St Luke's Road into shared permit and paid parking for 4 hours (no return within 4 hours)

Brighton & Hove Outer Areas (Waiting, Loading and Parking) and Cycle Lanes Consolidation Order 2018 Amendment Order No.1 2024 (ref: TRO-43b-2023)

This Order when it comes into force will introduce pedal cycle hire scheme docking places in the following location:

Graham Avenue, Portslade

Modification

Following objections to the order as originally proposed and advertised on 6th October 2023 and Transport and Sustainability Committee on 5th December 2023 it was decided to not proceed with on carriageway pedal cycle docking place in Northease Drive this will instead now be installed off the highway. This also means that no changes will take place to the limited waiting in this location.
