

BRIGHTON & HOVE CITY COUNCIL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

Brighton & Hove (Red Routes) (Lewes Road) Experimental Order 2024 (ref: TRO-4a-2024)

NOTICE is hereby given that Brighton & Hove City Council (“the Council”) made the above-named experimental Order on the 22 May 2024 under the relevant provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended which comes into force on 25 May 2024. This order is a modification of the existing Brighton & Hove (Red Routes) (Lewes Road) Experimental Order 2024 which came into force on 15 April 2024 for a period not exceeding eighteen months. The effect of the Order will be as follows:

- Updating the articles and descriptions in the order of the red route restrictions (no stopping or waiting at any time) and loading bay on Lewes Road from Elm Grove to the Vogue Gyratory following implementation – no changes will be made on the ground.

A copy of the experimental Order as made, plans showing the lengths of road affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for making this Order may be seen online at www.brighton-hove.gov.uk/current-tros.

The Council will be considering in due course whether the provisions of the experimental Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Any person wishing to object to such indefinite continuation of the provisions may within a period of six months from 25 May 2024, (or if this Order is varied by another Order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the Act, six months from the day on which the variation or modification or the latest variation or modification came into force) object in writing stating the grounds on which that objection is being made. Objections should be sent to the Corporate Director City Services, Brighton & Hove City Council Parking Design & Implementation Team, G40 Hove Town Hall, Norton Road Hove, BN3 3BQ or by e-mail to TROcomment@brighton-hove.gov.uk or online (see details above) no later than 25 November 2024. In all cases the reference TRO-4a-2024 should be quoted.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the experimental Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirements of the Act or of any instrument made under it have not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for that purpose.
