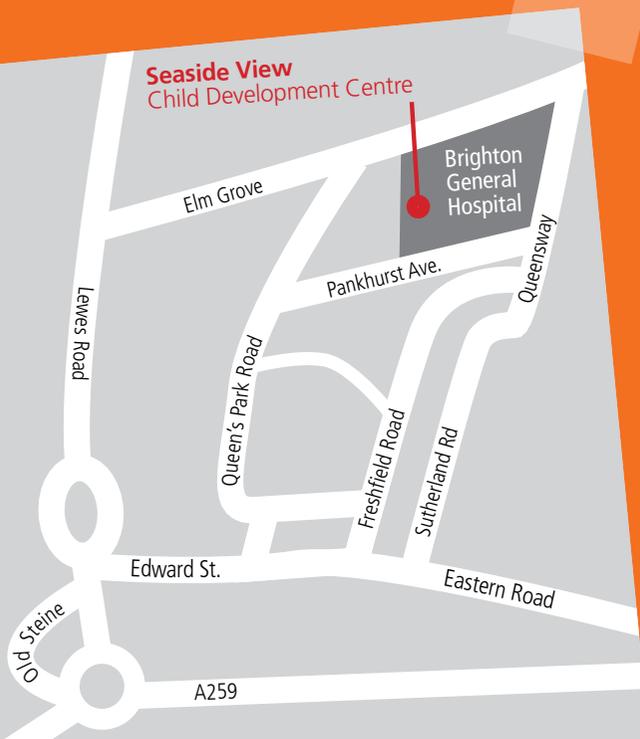

What do we do?

We are a flexible and responsive service committed to working in partnership with parents/carers and children as well as other services such as education, social care and voluntary services.

We offer a range of services including:

- Assessment, diagnosis and management of speech, language, communication difficulties.
- Direct and indirect therapy, in groups or individually, depending on the needs of the child and family.
- Contribution to meetings with other professionals.
- Specific training packages as required to parents/carers; health, social care or education providers; outside agencies; and the voluntary sector.



Who do we see?

Referrals for children within the special schools and units can be made by any professional with parental consent.

We see children who:

- Present with severe speech, language and communication difficulties.
- Have speech and language therapy identified in the Statement of Special Educational Needs.
- Have been referred for assessment where Speech and Language Therapy has not previously been identified as a need.

How do we work with others?

Parents

We encourage parents to take an active role in their child's speech and language development. Copies of reports and targets are sent home via school or directly. Parents can request to meet their child's SLT and this can be arranged by contacting the SLT at school.

Other professionals

We work closely with the teaching and support staff within the school/unit to ensure that the child's speech and language programme is an integral part of their school day. We provide assessment and intervention as required, and attend meetings with other professionals. We will liaise with other people working with the child.

Information about you

All the speech and language therapists work as part of the Children and Families Service. The information you give is kept confidential to the service and may be shared between team members and other staff to help plan the best care for your child. All information we share is on a "need to know" basis and everyone will act professionally with the information you give us.

We will use some of the information for monitoring purposes to make sure we are offering the right service to meet local needs. In special circumstances we may need to share information with other professionals, for example, to keep a child safe and protected from harm. Where possible we will tell you what we are sharing.
