

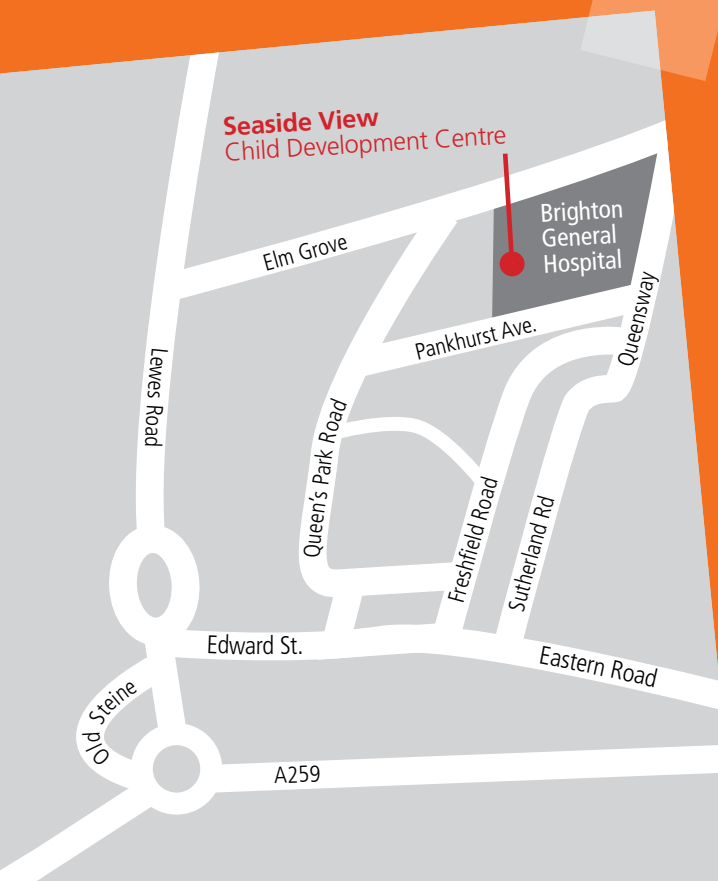

Physiotherapy for Children

Child Development and Disability Service

In Brighton & Hove there are two paediatric physiotherapy services covering the city.

This one is based at Seaside View Child Development Centre and is part of the integrated child development and disability service. We generally treat children with complex needs and/or developmental difficulties. The other is based at the Royal Alexandra Children's Hospital and provides in-patient care, as well as out-patient management of respiratory, musculo-skeletal and rheumatological conditions.

What do we do?

Treatment is based on an assessment of a child's needs and may include an individual treatment programme, advice, provision of orthotics or a combination of these. Paediatric physiotherapists recognise the importance of working in partnership with children's parents and carers to maximise a child's physical abilities and independence.



We work with:

- Occupational therapists
- Paediatricians
- Teachers
- School nurses
- GPs
- Social workers
- Speech and language therapists
- Psychologists
- Orthotists
- Dieticians

Conditions treated

At Seaside View Child Development Centre the physiotherapists treat a wide range of conditions including:

- Developmental delay
- Neurological or neuromuscular disorders eg Cerebral Palsy, Muscular Dystrophy
- Congenital syndromes and metabolic diseases eg Down syndrome, Rett Syndrome
- Co-ordination difficulties

The child development and disability physiotherapy service may also visit community settings such as schools, nurseries or homes.

To make a referral contact us via your GP or health visitor.

All referrals go to the Seaside View Child Development Centre referrals panel and are assigned to the appropriate professional.

Professionals

All of our paediatric physiotherapists have specialist knowledge and experience of treating children and of childhood disabilities, and are registered with the Health Professional Council (HPC) and are members of the Chartered Society of Physiotherapy.

Information about you

The information you give is kept confidential to Children and Families Services and may be shared between team members and other staff to help plan the best care for your child. All information we share is on a "need to know" basis and everyone will act professionally with the information you give us. We will use some of the information for monitoring purposes to make sure we are offering the right service to meet local needs. In special circumstances we may need to share information with other professionals, for example, to keep a child safe and protected from harm. Where possible we will tell you what we are sharing.
