The natural beauty of the South Downs
National Park surrounds the north of the
city making it easily accessible for walking,
cycling and paragliding. Glyndebourne, a world
class opera house is just over 12 miles away,
near the historical market town of Lewes.

The city has a rich and colourful past which is reflected through its heritage and architecture. The iconic Royal Pavilion and Dome denote the Regency period; whilst the Brighton Palace Pier offers a traditional seaside experience, and has done since the 1900's.

The futuristic i360 creates the millennium experience as the world's tallest vertical pier offering panoramic views across land and sea.
